**Approval of minutes -** The Minutes of the 20<sup>th</sup> February 2018 were approved and signed.

#### **Matters Arising**

- a) Two new members of GPC- CN welcomed Rob and Paul (who was unable to attend) to GPC.
- b) Register of Members Interest forms- Clerk has distributed the forms for all members to complete and return to him at the next meeting. Clerk will send on to Kiren Kalirai Monitoring Officer Technical Support and PA to Corporate Legal Manager at NHDC.

### 1. Highways Report

- a) Stevenage Local Plan -On 13 November 2017 the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government issued a direction under section 21A of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 (inserted by section 145(5) of the Housing and Planning Act 2016) to Stevenage Borough Council not to take any step in connection with the adoption of the Local Plan. This direction will remain in force until he withdraws it or gives a direction under section 21 of the 2004 Act requiring modification of the Plan.
- b) NHDC Local Plan-CN reported on the NHDC Local Plan Examination hearing session which related to Graveley and Great Ashby, held on 26th February 2018. Jack Rigg representing Graveley Parish Council objected strongly to the developments proposed which will affect Graveley. Other groups supporting Graveley in orally objecting to the NHDC Local Plan were Council for the Protection of Rural England, The Friends of Forster Country, Ramblers' Association, Save Our World's First Garden City Group, Herts & Middlesex Badger Group, Certs Against The Badger Cull, Weston Parish Council and residents, District Cllr Steve Jarvis plus Graveley residents objecting in their own right. Every concern listed by Graveley villagers in the Survey distributed to all households was covered in minute detail plus Biodiversity, represented by The Real Environment Group. Both Hertfordshire County Council and Stevenage Borough Council were unhappy about the educational provision in the NHDC Local Plan high level discussions took place on this subject 14 objectors, and 40 supporters attended the Hearing Session. Supporters included major developers involved in the proposed developments, their barristers/legal teams/experts, NHDC and Stevenage Borough Council Senior Planning Staff and their barristers plus Fairview Hotels. Q.C. agreed that all the objections raised were valid ones.

CN reported the concerns received from a Gt Ashby resident and environmental bodies represented at the NHDC Local Plan Examination over whether the scale of so many developments could have a detrimental effect on local household water supply and the environment in the event of a drought. Checks are being made in Gt Ashby by Affinity Water. CN has made enquiries about Air Quality measurement in Graveley and there is a device situated in Graveley High Street which monitors Air Pollution, looked after by NHDC.
